‘Tannenbaum’ Mugo Pine

Pinus mugo

Family: Pinaceae

Stem & Leaf Type: evergreen tree

Size: 15’ tall x 12’ wide

USDA Hardiness Zones: 3-7

Leaves : Paired, 1-2” finely toothed needles. Rigid and blunt with stomatic lines on both surfaces.

Leaf Color: medium to dark green

Fall Color: medium green to yellowish green

Flower Time: Non-flowering

Flower Color: Non-flowering

Fruit: cones, short-stalked, 1-2” x 0.5-1.5” long

Light: full sun-part sun

Moisture: well-drained

Insect/Disease Issues: rust, borers, and scale

Nativity: Europe

Location in the Gardens:

North Mixed Border

Culture & Landscape Value: A small pyramidal pine with even growth and a straight leader. Should be used as a specimen. Highly adaptable and hardy.

Notes:

One of the first single-stem *P. mugo* cultivars developed.
