Stonecrop
Sedum sp

Family: Crassulaceae

Stem & Leaf Type: perennial
Size: 12-24" tall; 18-30" wide
USDA Hardiness Zones: 3
Leaves: succulent, margins entire or dentate
Leaf Color: medium to dark green
Fall Color: yellow
Flowers: July-October
Fruit: not ornamental
Light: full sun
Moisture: well-drained—dry
Insect/Disease Issues: none serious
Nativity: Asia
Location in the Gardens: Front Yard Garden

Culture & Landscape Value:
 Drought tolerant perennial with attractive pink to purple flowers in fall. Attractive to butterflies, bees, and other nectar-feeding insects. Becomes floppy in too much shade or with age. Can be divided in spring.
